TEACHING THE WORD

WFTO has continued to encourage and disciple believers within the villages where we have provided clean water. This year marks the third year of such teaching in the villages of Kanyanja and Chilambila. The Lord has provided one new church plant from within the Chilambila outreach while the Kanyanja work continues to grow. We added one additional teaching center this year, Chanyanya Harbor, which is located in the bush along the Kafue River. Please join us as we pray for the people of these areas to be such as Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 2:15 - "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

THE WRITTEN WORD OF GOD

If someone were to ask: What is one of the top priorities within the ministry in Zambia? The clear answer would be... placing the written Word of God into a person's hand!

The Word is foundational: "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God" (John 1:1-2)





Health & Hygiene Teaching

The Word is a guide: "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105)

The Word is transformational: "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit,

and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

During the past two years, WFTO has been blessed beyond measure with donations specifically earmarked for Bibles. These very donations provide the bibles presented to new believers as they respond to the preaching of the Word during the hygiene training.

In regards to church leaders, it is not unusual to find pastors and church leaders who lack a bible and to a greater extent lack biblical study materials. In 2013, study bibles were first distributed to the pastors and church leaders who participated in leadership training. The students who received the first

study bibles were just amazed with the vast amount of study notes found inside of the bibles. In response to how those first students received the study bibles, WFTO has continued presenting study bibles to

PROVIDING MANZI

WFTO donors, in 2014, have provided clean manzi (water) to approximately 4,000 individuals through hand pump repairs. The repairs have comprised of the simple removal of a piece of plastic

lodged in the pump cylinder to the complete replacement of a hand pump including the concrete apron surrounding the borehole. It is through these very repairs that we establish our future discipleship teachings. Our goal is to build a long term relationship with a village that begins with providing clean manzi and continues as we frequently revisit the villages through the discipleship teachings.

The villages, in which we repair the hand pumps, are located in remote areas and are comprised of people with minimal amounts of income. So, if you combine their remote area and low income you will begin to understand that the needs

of these people ofgo unnoticed. ten One example of this was recently brought our attention. to WFTO travelled to a remote area and as we began to repair the hand pumps the people spoke of how they had raised funds to have the hand pump repairs



completed. As the story unfolded, we learned that each village had raised several hundred US dollars and had given the funds to a community leader. Can you guess what happened? The money somehow became lost. The sad part is the people went to extreme measures to generate the funds as you consider the average yearly income of a villager is believed to be in the \$300 per year range. So, needless to say the people are extremely happy to have new hand pumps as they prepare for the upcoming rainy season.

Initially the hand pump repairs seemed to be a complete loss as a result of the "lost money". However, the Lord turned a loss into a blessing, as the hand pumps of the villages were

repaired through the generosity of WFTO The Lord donors. has established a relationship strong with these particular villages through a simple principle: Say what you will do and do what you sav! these villages and informed the community leaders that

we would in fact repair the broken hand pumps. We honored that word. What a tremendous opportunity for ministry!

EDUCATION

During the past eight years Water for the Oppressed has assisted individuals with educational sponsorship as donors were available. Although WFTO focuses on providing water and the Word, we currently have six individuals in need of educational sponsorship. A brief description for each individual is listed below.

Currently, we have two orphans in need of sponsorship. Water for the Oppressed has known and sponsored one orphan since 2006 and now she is entering college (teacher) as of January 2, 2015. The second orphan was brought to our attention, in late 2012, through the discipleship program. WFTO has sponsored the educational needs of this orphan since January 2013 and he will enter grade 12 in 2015. The two orphans are now in need of continuing sponsorship.

In addition, there are several other educational needs. WFTO has known and sponsored one additional individual since 2006. On January 2, 2015 she will enter year two of college (teacher) and is in need of a sponsor.

In September, a friend of ours passed away in Zambia leaving behind a wife and five children. One of his children is currently in college, entering the last semester of year two in January 2015, and a daughter who recently graduated from high school is eager to attend college. The youngest of the siblings is preparing to enter grade six in January 2015. The son, daughter and youngest sibling are in need of sponsorship.

Leslie and I have known the above mentioned students from one to eight years. It is encouraging to hear of their desire to attend college and pursue careers such as teaching, nursing,
